2. CURRENT STATUS OF BUSINESS RESCUE PROCEEDINGS

- 1. I P T (Pty) Limited ('the Company") was placed under Business Rescue in terms of Section 129(1) of the Companies Act 2008 ("the Act") on 15 December 2020.
- 2. The Company complied with the requirements of Section 129(3)(a) and (b) of the Act.
- Johannes Frederick Klopper was licensed by the Commission in respect of the Company and appointed as Business Rescue Practitioner (BRP) to this company on 15 December 2020 in terms of Section 138 of the Act.
- 4. The First Meeting of Creditors was held in terms of Section 147 of the Act on 7 January 2021.
- 5. The business rescue plan was published on 15 February 2021 and adopted at a meeting held on 22 February 2021. The outcome of the implementation of the business rescue plan will be known as soon as the realisation of the immovable properties belonging to Gragood Developments (Pty) Limited (Under Business Rescue) is completed.
- 6. The sale of the immovable property known as the Helen Zille Wing was approved by Gragood's creditors and contained in a supplementary business rescue plan published on 27 September 2021.
