2. Current status of business rescue proceeding

Kindly note: This is the 29th monthly report submitted by the BRPs. As is required by law the BRPs will going forward provide Affected Parties with a monthly report, updating such parties on the progress of the business rescue process.

Each subsequent status report must be read together with all previous status reports and that the information contained in the most recent report only contain a record of events and/or information that have transpired subsequent to the publication of the previous month's status report.

2.1 Elandspruit:

- 2.1.1 As previously reported the opencast operation operated in conjunction with Masemanzi Mining, which agreement ran until the end of March 2026.
- 2.1.2 The coal mined in terms of this arrangement was earmarked for delivery to Eskom's Kusile power station, as part of the ongoing rectification obligations of Neosho, sister company within the Salungano Group.
- 2.1.3 As reported deliveries to Kusile have since November 2025 experienced several challenges, culminating in a total stop on deliveries during December 2025.
- 2.1.4 The BRPs and Masemanzi are in the process of finding alternative sources for the disposal of the coal already mined and stockpiled on site, with Masemanzi indicating that it intended taking tonnages for processing in May 2026. A further 20,000 tons were earmarked for removal. Reconciliations of remaining tonnages and account finalisation are under way and will run into June 2026.
- 2.1.5 As previously reported the BRPs commenced with a public process seeking to dispose of the Elandspruit operations. A number of bids were received and the BRPs will continue to engage with these parties regarding the potential future sale or operation of the Elandspruit asset. Initial contracting is underway and we hoped to finalise by end May 2026 in terms of a proposed transaction. This date has not been achieved. Meetings will be held with Salungano and key stakeholders in June 2026 to expedite an outcome.

2.2 Khanyisa:

- 2.2.1 Operations at Khanyisa remain in care and maintenance for some time, with some short-term project approved to access some lower grade stockpiles on site. The BRPs initially anticipated that this project would be concluded by 31 December 2025. However, some coal remains to be processed, which has extended the timeline for completion of the project.
- 2.2.2 Other initiatives at Khanyisa remain ongoing and unchanged from previous reports.

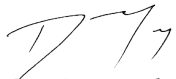
2.3 Processing Plant:

- 2.3.1 The Wescoal processing facility was identified as one of the prime sources of revenue and all effort has been made to commence toll washing operations on site over since Business Rescue began.
- 2.3.2 The untimely war in the Gulf has significantly impacted the coal industry in general and in particular the delivery of ROM to the processing plant for beneficiation. Urgent meetings were called with OLF for May to assess the impact on cash flow and propose a return to normalised processing levels. This has unfortunately been unsuccessful. A process to cease operations at the plant was commenced. This included consultations with affected staff and key suppliers. Thjs will run into June 2026.

3. Additional Matters

- 3.1 Various other matters have also needed to be dealt with, and next steps considered, being *inter alia*:

- 3.1.1 The action plan to address the audit findings from the Department remains in progress, and in the interim Wescoal Mining is unable to return discard to the pit, requiring alternative processing arrangements for washed product.
- 3.1.2 Engagement with the BRPs of Arnot Opco regarding the proceedings of that business rescue remain ongoing.
- 3.1.3 Environmental Aspects at Wescoal Mining:
 - 3.1.3.1 The non-compliance with environmental requirements on all the Wescoal Mining sites are substantial. As recorded in the adopted Business Rescue Plan, one of the key objectives of the business rescue process is to remediate as much of these non-compliances.



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
